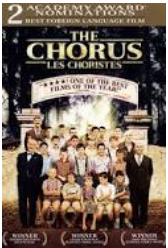

Jan. 28—film “The Great Debaters” (US)

Poet and professor Melvin B. Tolson (Denzel Washington) teaches at the predominately black Wiley College in 1935 Texas. He decides to start a debate team, something nearly unheard of at a black college. *Historic, engaging, socially relevant.*



March 25—film “The Chorus” (French)

The new teacher at a severely administered boys' boarding school works to positively affect the students' lives through music. Nominated for two Academy Awards. *Delightful and engaging.*

A great story.



May 27—film “Many Beautiful Things” (Brit.

/Algeria) An untold story that plunges viewers into the complex age of Victorian England to meet Lillias Trotter, a daring young woman who defied all norms by winning the favor of England's top art critic, John Ruskin, but then makes a choice that puts her life on a different course. *Inspiring and aesthetically beautiful.*



July 22— film “The Lives of Others” (E.

German) In 1984 East Berlin, an agent of the secret police, conducting surveillance on a writer and his lover, finds himself becoming increasingly absorbed by their lives. *Winner, Best Foreign Film. Intriguing and liberating.*



Sept. 23—film 23 “Landfill Harmonic”

(Ecuador) Music director Favio Chavez guides the Recycled Orchestra of Cateura, a Paraguayan group that plays instruments made entirely out of garbage. *Meaningful, inspiring.*



Nov. 25— film “Septembers in Shiraz” (Iran)

After creating a prosperous life in Iran, a Jewish family may be forced to abandon everything as the revolution of 1979 looms on the horizon. *An insightful look into Iranian society today.*
