...A Weeklong Tribute to World War I Heroes: Monday through Friday, November 7-11, with special exhibits, 2 concerts, (fee), book signing, symposium, and WWI era car display. Some events with assistance of local Daughters of the American Revolution.

...Annual Orville Rogers **Run for the Hills**, Saturday **Nov. 12:** Register online (fee is \$35 in Nov) or in person up to 7:00am on run day (fee is \$40); do either a 5.K run or 1 mile walk.
